The 19th of Kislev is the anniversary of the date when Rabbi Schneur Zalman, the first Chabad rebbe, was released from prison in 1798. He was imprisoned due to libelous information supplied to the czarist government by opponents of the fledgling chassidic movement.

In a letter written after his release from prison, the Alter Rebbe described the moment of his release: "On the day G-d made for us, the 19th of Kislev . . . while I was reading in the book of Psalms the verse, 'He redeemed my soul in peace from battle,' before beginning the following verse, I emerged in peace . . . '

A peaceful victory precedes even the battle. This is the power of unity. Adversaries become friends, and the world joins in harmonious service of G-d.



A Chanukah Story

Rabbi Pesachya of Kherson once related the following story about his Rebbe, the Rebbe Rashab of Lubavitch: One summer, I had a private audience with the Rebbe, and he told me the following: "You work in the forests, and sometimes you even need to spend a few days in a row in the forest. When Chanukah arrives, don't forget to bring big candles with you."

On Chanukah, I indeed needed to spend a few days in the forest and was sure to bring some large candles with me. While in the forest, thieves came upon me, took all my money and said they were going to kill me. I pleaded with them, but they said they had no choice but to kill me. I asked them if I could have one final request, to light Chanukah candles for one last time, and they agreed. As I was lighting the candles, a local landowner passed nearby and saw the light. He had a revolver with him, chased away the robbers and saved me."


